A. PUBLIC RECORDS/OFFICIAL PUBLICATIONS

DISCUSSED

1. Abusive Public Records Requests. Urges the Legislature to amend A.R.S. § 39-121.01 to place reasonable limitations on requests for public records that are overbroad or abusive. Such limitations may include the scope of requests, the time period covered in a request, and the number of requests from a single individual during a specified time period and allowing charges for requests that exceed statutorily established limitations.

2. Publication to Official Websites. Urges the Legislature amend statutes requiring cities to publish notices, agendas, reports, and other statutorily mandated publications in a newspaper to allow cities and towns the option to publish on an official website.

DISCUSSED B. PSPRS

Changes to Member Contribution Rates. Urges the Legislature to maintain PSPRS member funding levels established in 2011.

DISCUSSED C. HURF

Restore Full HURF Distribution to Cities. Urges the legislature to stop sweeps of Highway User Revenue Funds (HURF) allocated to Arizona cities and towns and to restore HURF funding according to the current statutory formulas.

DISCUSSED D. WATER

ADWR Municipality Fees. Asks that the fees charged to cities by ADWR be proportional to the services provided to each municipality.

DISCUSSED E. PUBLIC SAFETY

1. Certificate of Necessity. Amend the laws and regulations for granting a Certificate of Necessity (CON) and allow cities & towns the authority to provide emergency ambulance transportation services within their jurisdictions.

DISCUSSED 2. 911 Sweeps. Restore full funding of the 911 monies to enable the State, cities and counties to continue to develop, upgrade and maintain emergency communication systems.
