



# Registration Information

## OUR MISSION:

Enriching lives through quality programs, experiences, and facilities that preserve the past, provide for the present, plan for the future, and promote the spirit of fun.

This Fall and Winter, Yuma Parks and Recreation is offering a variety of opportunities for all ages through recreational programming, classes, and activities, while striving to provide excellent customer satisfaction at every level.

## PROGRAM REGISTRATION:

Program registration will be held beginning September 14, 2020 for all residents, and will continue throughout the Fall and Winter season. On-line registration will also begin on Monday, September 14, 2020 for programs not requiring a birth certificate/registration form. Some programs are limited to the number of participants and will close when a program fills. If a class or program you are interested in is full, please ask to be put on a "wait list". Wait lists will be used should vacancies occur or class expansion is feasible. Various program fees are discounted for qualifying City of Yuma residents. For the purpose of registration, a Yuma resident is defined as any person living within the corporate limits of the City of Yuma.

## CHILDREN'S AGE REQUIREMENTS:

Age requirements are established to safely facilitate age appropriate classes. Children must be the appropriate age by the first day of class or date specified in order to register – no exceptions.

Registration forms are available in the Parks and Recreation Office and on the City of Yuma website: [yumaaz.gov/parksandrec](http://yumaaz.gov/parksandrec).

**Online** registration at [yumaaz.gov/parksandrec](http://yumaaz.gov/parksandrec) (Some programs are not available for online registration.) Please verify your online profile information when registering.

**Walk-In** registration is available. Please call ahead for up to date hours of operation. (City Hall is closed on alternate Fridays.)

Registration may also be taken at the Yuma Readiness and Community Center, as well as at the North End Community Center.

**Fax-In** registration forms 24 hours a day to (877) 782-2584, then pay over the phone using MasterCard, Discover, Visa, or American Express.

**Mail-In** registration to Yuma Parks and Recreation, One City Plaza, Yuma, Arizona, 85364.

**Phone-In** registration using MasterCard, Visa, Discover or American Express. Our phone line is (928) 373-5200. This option is not available when a registration form is required. \*\*Walk-in registration will have priority, and you may be placed on hold or asked to have your call returned based on the volume of customers waiting in line at the time.

**After Hours** drop off registration is available by using the slot at the front of Yuma City Hall, One City Plaza.

## CONSIDER YOUR SCHEDULE CAREFULLY BEFORE REGISTERING

We encourage registrants to consider their schedule carefully prior to registering for any program or class offered. **Transfers and refunds will be considered if requested at least two weeks prior to start date.** A \$7 processing fee will be applied to all refunds.

After the program starts, refunds will not be considered. No cash refunds will be issued. Refunds will be processed within 10 business days.

We reserve the right to cancel classes/programs due to insufficient registration or other causes beyond our control.

**Fees, dates, and times are subject to change.**

We reserve the right to photograph facilities, activities, and program participants for potential future use in advertising. All photos will remain the property of the City of Yuma.

Some programs will not be held on City recognized holidays. In addition, there are dates that programs will not be scheduled due to other special events.

# City of Yuma News Briefs



## Vote on Nov. 3

In addition to consequential state, local and federal races and issues, the City of Yuma will have two propositions on the ballot for the General Election this Nov. 3. These propositions seek to place the City Charter in

conformance with current Arizona law.

Here's what to do:

- Register online at Service Arizona ([servicearizona.com](http://servicearizona.com)).
- Already registered? Check your registration status there or through the office of the Yuma County Recorder or at [servicearizona.com](http://servicearizona.com).
- If you wish to vote by mail, request an early ballot through the Yuma County Recorder ([www.yumacountyaz.gov/government/recorder](http://www.yumacountyaz.gov/government/recorder)).
- Return your early ballot by Nov. 3, preferably a week before Election Day to ensure delivery.
- If voting in person, find the nearest convenient vote center and vote on Nov. 3.



## Make appointments to drop off hazardous and electronic waste

On the second Friday of each month, the City of Yuma holds a Household Haz-

ardous Waste collection event, where we encourage residents to drop off unwanted corrosive, flammable, toxic or reactive materials used in or around your home or personal vehicle.

For personal safety, the City requires appointments for drop-offs. To schedule an appointment, residents should call Public Works at 373-4504 or email [publicworksadministr@yumaaz.gov](mailto:publicworksadministr@yumaaz.gov).

Accepted waste includes items from old latex paint, vehicle fluids and cleaning fluids to solid items such as tires, batteries and electronic components or small appliances.

This is a program for residential waste. No commercial or farm waste will be accepted. If you have any questions about acceptable items, consult the Public Works section of the City's website ([www.yumaaz.gov](http://www.yumaaz.gov)) or call 373-4504.

## Pay your city services bill

While service disconnections remained on a temporary moratorium this summer, the City reminds residents that their city services bills remain due. Furthermore, the City advises residents not to let their accounts fall behind to such a degree that disconnection becomes likely.



The most convenient way to pay your city services bill is online with "myUMA" ("my Utilities Management Account"). With myUMA you can:

- Access your myUMA website account.
  - Create a personal profile to eliminate the need of having to remember specific utility information to access your account.
  - Automatically enroll into paperless bills (you can opt back in for paper bills).
  - Consolidate multiple utility accounts (under one convenient login) into one master account.
  - Quickly log into your account.
  - View balances and payment history of single or multiple accounts.
  - View monthly statements for single or multiple accounts.
  - Receive statement reminders via email.
  - Set up multiple payment accounts (Business checking, personal checking and credit card) all under one login.
  - Set up recurring payments.
  - Securely store payment information for a quicker, easier process during subsequent payments.
  - And of course, pay your utility bill online by check or credit card.
- For even more convenience, look for the free mobile device app.





### Report graffiti at 329-2828

Keeping our community clean should be a “no-brainer” – a clean community is nicer to live in, invites visitors to spend more time and

money here, and takes less of your tax money to maintain. But until we get to a point where people understand the consequences of vandalism and graffiti and refrain from doing these actions, the City remains vigilant in our efforts to mitigate them. It's important to remember and use the Graffiti Busters hotline, (928) 329-2828, to report graffiti anywhere you see it in the Yuma area. In most cases, the City can clean or cover graffiti within 48 hours, though some cases that may require special assistance from the property owner. Crews work with the Yuma Police Department to document these activities and build cases when offenders are caught. Plus, state law now allows the City to seek restitution for the labor and materials required to clean the graffiti. Help us keep Yuma looking its best!

### Volunteer to serve on a board or commission

Getting the “voice of the public” into decision-making is very important to the City of Yuma, and this is a role filled by volunteer members of various boards and commissions within the City. If you have an interest in serving your community, consider applying for a position on one of our boards or commissions.

Any person who lives within Yuma's City limits may serve on a board or commission. Several boards of a more technical nature require one or more members to have specific technical expertise.

Service on a board or commission is a great way to gain an understanding of how the City operates. It's ideal both for those who may wish to run for public office someday and those who may wish to serve but don't wish to interact in the kind of environment that comes with running in elections.

When an opening occurs due to resignation or term expiration, City Council appoints an individual from the list of applications on file in the Office of the Mayor and Council. The individual is selected based on education, work experience and civic involvement as listed on the application. Formal appointment occurs at a regularly scheduled City Council meeting.

In order to be considered for a board or commission, file a Boards and Commissions application with the City Clerk's Office on the first floor of City Hall.



### Stay Safe Outdoors

During times of social and physical distancing the ability to enjoy our city's outdoor spaces is becoming more important and valuable than ever.

Our parks give citizens various opportunities for physical activities and provide a connection to the outdoors which are beneficial to our physical and mental well being. The City of Yuma's parks, trails, and open spaces continue to be open and available for the safe enjoyment of everyone.

We encourage all users to follow these recommendations when taking advantage of our outdoor amenities:

- Refrain from using parks or trails if you are exhibiting symptoms.
- Follow CDC's guidance on personal hygiene prior to and during use of parks or trails.
- Prepare for limited access to water fountains.
- While on trails, warn other users of your presence and step aside to let others pass.
- Follow CDC guidance on the recommended size of social gatherings including outdoor picnicking, pick-up sports and other group hangouts, and maintain proper physical distance at all times.
- Observe CDC's minimum recommended physical distancing of 6 feet from other individuals at all times. If this is not possible, users should find an alternate location or depart that space.

Let's all do our part to use our outdoor spaces in a way that respects each other and public health guidance.






