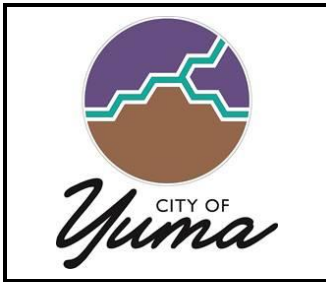


Notice of Public Hearing of the Planning & Zoning Commission of the City of Yuma

As a part of the public hearing process, the City Planning & Zoning Commission is authorized to consider appropriate alternate Zoning Districts, which are no more intensive in development activity than the requested Zoning District. Additionally, the Commission is authorized to supplement requested rezoning actions with the Aesthetic Overlay (AO) District and/or the Public Designation (P) District as may be deemed appropriate.

1. **SUBD-24633-2018:** This is a request by Dahl, Robins & Associates, Inc., on behalf of Barkley Limited Partnership, for approval of the preliminary plat for the Livingston Ranch Unit No. 2 Subdivision. This subdivision will contain approximately 32.58 acres, and is proposed to be divided into 99 residential lots, ranging in size from 7,364 square feet to 14,683 square feet. The property is located at the northwest corner of 40th Street and Avenue B ½ Yuma, AZ.
