**Notice of Potential Quorum
Yuma Day at the Capitol**

March 16 - 18, 2026

Members of the Yuma City Council may attend meetings and events at the Arizona State Capitol in Phoenix, Arizona as part of Yuma Day at the Capitol.

During this time, Councilmembers may have the opportunity to meet with members of the Arizona Legislature, state agencies, and other stakeholders to discuss issues affecting the City of Yuma and municipalities across Arizona. Topics may include local revenue and municipal authority, water security and Colorado River reliability, economic development and innovation, housing and local planning authority, community infrastructure and quality of life, and state legislation impacting municipalities.

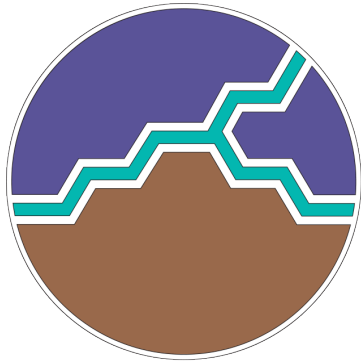
Councilmembers may be invited to participate in meetings or discussions with several state leaders and offices, including Yuma's Legislative Delegation, House and Senate leadership, the House Minority Caucus, the Speaker of the House, the Senate President, the Governor's Office, the Secretary of State, and the Attorney General. Activities may include legislative office visits, introductions on the House and Senate floors, policy discussions with state officials, a legislative lunch, and a legislative reception.

These meetings and events are organized by external offices and organizations, and City Councilmembers may attend individually as part of Yuma Day at the Capitol.

Activities may take place at the Arizona State Capitol complex, legislative offices, agency offices, and other related locations.

A quorum of the City Council may be present at these events; however, members will not discuss, deliberate, or take legal action on any matter within the jurisdiction of the City Council in accordance with Arizona's Open Meeting Law.

Additional meetings with legislators, legislative staff, or state agencies not specifically listed above may occur.

YUMA DAY AT THE CAPITOL SUMMARY (Minutes):

Pursuant to A.R.S 431.01(F) no legal action was taken, and no recordings were made during the March 17-18, 2026, Yuma Day at the Arizona State Capitol.

The City of Yuma City Council (with the exception of Deputy Mayor Leslie McClendon) met with State officials and legislators at the Arizona Capitol on March 17 and 18, 2026. The City Council met with Governor's staff; the Secretary of State and staff; the delegation of Representatives and Senators from Legislative District 23 and 25; the President of the Senate; the Speaker of the House; the Senate Minority Leadership; the House Majority Leadership; the House Minority Leadership; and the ADOT Director and State Engineer. The Yuma City Council discussed critical issues impacting Yuma, including the preservation of local decision-making authority, preserving local revenues, supporting economic development and community quality of life in Yuma, and Yuma's Colorado River rights with the forthcoming federal Post-2026 Colorado River Operations. No legal action was taken at Yuma Day at the Capitol.
